




# SELF SACRIFICING – LEADING BY EXAMPLE

36 Joseph, a Levite from Cyprus, whom the apostles called Barnabas (which means “son of encouragement”), 37 sold a field he owned and brought the money and put it at the apostles’ feet.

ACTS 4:36-37

- Make your own bed first
- Order from Chaos (Gen 1)
- Small changes make huge impacts in unforeseen ways
- God is a god of multiplication and your 1% each day is 2x improvement in 100 days!



# MENTOR THROUGH TO SUCCESSION

25 Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, 26 and when he found him, he brought him to Antioch. So for a whole year Barnabas and Saul met with the church and taught great numbers of people. The disciples were called Christians first at Antioch.

# MISSION SUCCESS

- First time followers of the way were recognized as different to Jews
- Church was recognized as following Christ
- Took offerings to Jerusalem
- Set apart to be missionaries and sent with John Mark.
- True leader doesn't need to be out front all the time

# MISSION SUCCESS

11 When the crowd saw what Paul had done, they shouted in the Lycaonian language, “The gods have come down to us in human form!” 12 Barnabas they called Zeus, and Paul they called Hermes because he was the chief speaker. 13 The priest of Zeus, whose temple was just outside the city, brought bulls and wreaths to the city gates because he and the crowd wanted to offer sacrifices to them.

# RELEASE AND REPEAT

- John Mark left part way through the first mission.
- Some say home sick, or fear of persecution.
- Paul could not resolve to take him on the second.
- Paul and Barnabas went separate directions
- Barnabas began leading the new recruit.

# A TRUE LEADER LOVES LIKE JESUS

1 If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. 3 If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. 4 Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. 5 It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. 6 Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. 7 It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

# PRODIGY IS BORN

- John Mark wrote the Gospel of Mark at a young age
- The writing is simple and it is effective to introduce new Christians to the Bible
- Barnabas continued to encourage Paul
- Paul and Mark reconciled in later years



# WHO IS A LEADER

- We are all meant to be leaders!
- We are a royal priesthood (1 Peter 2:9)
- Ambassadors of Christ sent by God (2 Cor 5:20)
- More than conquerors (Rom 8:37)
- Co-Heirs with Christ (Rom 8:17)
- We are all called and anointed to be leaders!
